Funding Highlights - H1 2022

God has been mightily faithful to us. So far so God, it is just the 7th month of the year and we have raised NGN 1,941,500 year to date for missionaries in Nigeria. NGN 1,267,500 from monthly contributions and NGN 677,000 for the Lome project.

The average amount raised from monthly contributions in 2022 has been about NGN 181,000, supported by the growth from 8 responders to 33 responders.

All funds received have been used to support missions in 8 Nigerian states (Kano, Kebbi, Niger, Katsina, Abuja, Kaduna, Jigawa, Nasarawa States) and one international mission station - Togo (Lomé). The breakdown of funds received per month is highlighted in the table below.

During my time on the field, we went out on evangelism, reaching both Christians and muslims, I discovered that language was a major barrier for me to communicate with them and the team had tracts written in Hausa Language for the ones that could read. I'm sure God was upstairs laughing, because one day in March, I was randomly scrolling on Instagram and I saw this [post](#) and *I knew in my Noah* that this was what I was going to do for my birthday.

Honestly, I struggled with the thought and was going to push it away, but God didn't let me rest, I reluctantly put up the post in April, telling God "there's no time to gather money, it's barely a month to my birthday, *anything we get, you'll collect it like that o*", I didn't even have a budget initially, eventually, I faithed the budget to 500k, God did me *ntor* and surpassed the budget and we closed out at NGN677,000.
